- The effects of extreme moisture and snow causing ice damming have revealed themselves in two regions of the library. Roof ridge venting and a wider ridge were accomplished on the north roof on April 8th. When inspecting the south roof it was discovered that the southernmost roof timbers require replacement and the ridge cap there will be upgraded as well. Moisture mitigation will follow roof repairs and will require closing the southern section of the library and moving the books to protect them during the process. The how, who, and when of the process is not yet determined. If volunteers are needed we will put out the word, but we are hoping for the professionals to take care of the entirety. Library operations will be fluid during this time, with some closure likely and otherwise operating from the conference room as we did during the height of the pandemic. The library is grateful to community partners both the Jemez Springs Community Presbyterian Church and the Canon Senior Center have offered use of space for library events during this time. Some events will be held outdoors. Thank you to all library staff and contractors for your help and flexibility!
- An upgrade in shelf-lighting for the adult fiction and non-fiction area is still upcoming. We requested the lights not be shipped during the library repair/mitigation process since storage would be an issue.
- The current project for the Library Board is to update the Strategic Plan, another document required by the State Library for funding and a helpful planning process. A draft has been created for review.
- Planning for the Summer Reading & Events continues... looking to be an exciting fun summer!
- Monthly book displays are returning to the library after a long hiatus with the pandemic reducing foot traffic. April is Poetry Month come choose a book or write a poem at our creation station!
